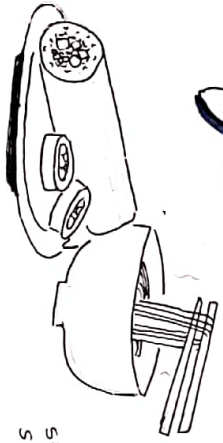


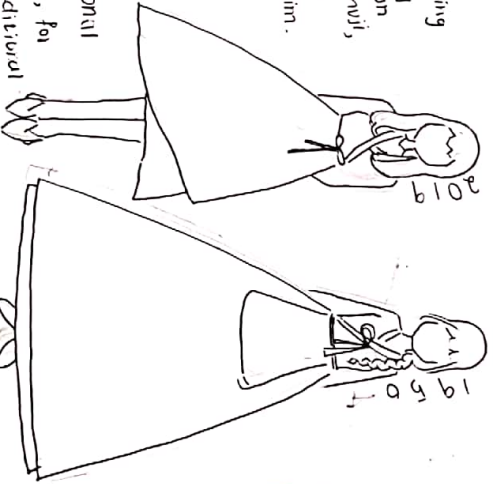

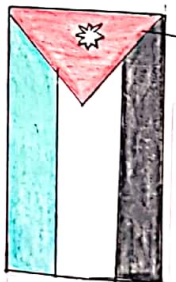
Hangul (Korean language) is entirely made by one man; King Sejong at 1418. Before Hangul is made, ancient Koreans used Chinese, but the King felt it's too hard to study for young people so he made it simpler.



Korean cuisine is the customary cooking traditions and practices of the culinary arts of Korea. One of the well-known meals is Kimbap. Cooked rice, danmuji (Korean style pickle), beef, cucumber, carrot, egg strips, etc are rolled in a thin meal to be eaten at picnics and outdoor events. Korean cuisines are similar to Japan cuisines.



A Hanbok is a traditional Korean dress from Joseon, for a formal attire during traditional occasions such as festivals, celebrations and ceremonies. It is characterized by vibrant colors and simple lines without pockets. Hanbok is eternally modernized into a simpler and comfortable cloth.
